Decision of ISU Disciplinary Commission

On April 3, 2018, the International Skating Union, represented by ISU Legal Advisor, Dr. Béatrice Pfister, filed a complaint including 18 exhibits against Ms. Weiguang Chen (the Alleged Offender), for Violations of the Duties of Judges and the ISU Code of Ethics.

Following consideration of the alleged violation of the Duties of Judges and the ISU Code of Ethics. the ISU Disciplinary Commission has, on June 18, 2018, taken the following decision:

Decision

1. *Ms. CHEN Weiguang has violated Rule 430 General e) and f) of ISU Special Regulations & Technical Rules Single and Pair Skating and Ice Dance 2016 and the Code of Ethics 2017.*
2. *Ms. CHEN Weiguang is suspended in her function as ISU Judge for Single & Pair Skating and International Judge for Ice Dance for two years, starting on the date of this decision.*
3. *Ms. CHEN Weiguang is excluded from officiating as Judge in Figure Skating Events at the occasion of the next Olympic Winter Games 2022 in Beijing.*
4. *All parties bear their own costs.*
5. *All other motions are dismissed.*

The decision of the Disciplinary Commission is published in full on the ISU website.

The present decision is subject to appeal to the Court of Arbitration for Sport, Avenue de Beaumont 2, CH-1012 Lausanne, Switzerland, within 21 days upon receipt of the decision, in accordance with Article 25 Paragraph 12 and Article 26 of the ISU Constitution 2016.
