### **ISU World Cup Speed Skating Series 2020/21**

November 13-15, 2020 November 20-22, 2020 December 4-6, 2020 December 11-13, 2020 February 17-18, 2021 March 6-7, 2021 (Final) Tomaszów Mazowiecki, POL Stavanger, NOR Salt Lake City, USA Calgary, CAN Changchun, CHN Heerenveen, NED

The above calendar, same as the calendar of other ISU series, is subject to a timely normalization of the Coronavirus situation allowing the safe organization of Ice Skating events in the season 2020/2021. The ISU is closely monitoring the respective developments in consultation with the organizing ISU Members with the expectation and hope that the situation will be restored to normal as quickly as possible. The ISU will inform ISU Members in case of any development or related ISU recommendations and/or decision.
