ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating Grenoble (FRA) reallocated to Gdansk (POL)

The ISU was informed by the Fédération Française des Sports de Glace (FFSG) of the cancellation of the [ISU Junior Grand Prix of Figure Skating](#) event that was scheduled to take place from September 28 to October 1, 2022 in Grenoble (FRA).

The Council decided to reallocate the event to Gdansk (POL) following a spontaneous application.

The ISU regrets that the hosting of the Event will not be in Grenoble as originally scheduled but is pleased that the event will take place in Gdansk and thanks the FFSG and Polish Figure Skating Association for their efforts and cooperation.
